A pastor put a note on Facebook saying that he's working on a sermon based on Zechariah 4:10, "Who has despised the day of small things?" He then asked the question, "What small things have you seen God use? Think of things I may have overlooked."

What would you answer be?

A song. A flower. A little boy's lunch. A baby in a manger. A teenage mother. A star. A cup of water. A couple of coins in the offering from a widow. Mustard seed.

How about the boy who gave his lunch to Jesus and ended up feeding five thousand (John 6:9) or the widow who dropped her two coins into the offering and went on her way (Mark 12:42). Neither had any way of knowing what this meant to the Lord or that we would still be talking about them 2,000 years later.
