My sister has been attending the Spring Harvest conference, which is held in the UK just after Easter, for several years now. This year, she invited me to join her in viewing the sessions which were made available online until the end of April. The devotion entitled "Unleashing Love in a Time of Fear" looked to Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, to bring some guidance for us in current times. The speaker drew four principles from Jesus' actions that night:

- 1. Jesus chose to go where he had often prayed before, where He had a familiar framework.
- 2. He identified to his three closest friends to be with Him.
- 3. He focussed on the goodness of God, and viewed his situation in the light of that goodness.
- 4. He did not hide His vulnerability either from His friends or from God.

Phil 4:6-9 guides us the same way:

⁶ Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

⁸ Finally, beloved,^[e] whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about^[f] these things. ⁹Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

These are words that we all need to hold on to, to rest in the peace that God gives to each one of us, and to share that peace with a hurting world.

For the last few weeks, I have been reflecting on this passage in James 1:2-8:

² Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, ³ because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. ⁴ Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. ⁵ If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. ⁶ But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. That person should not expect to receive anything from the Lord. ⁸Such a person is double -minded and unstable in all they do.

The last few weeks, it has felt like at times that I was in that wave, tossed about, trying to keep my head above water. It reminded me of the disciples caught in



the storm with Jesus asleep on the boat. Instead of feeling joy during this – instead of feeling a calm delight (because they would've been experiencing God's grace in the midst of the storm), they were feeling the exact opposite. Here was the creator of the universe - the I AM - the Messiah - in the boat with them – in the midst of *exactly* the same storm as them – yet he was so calm that he was asleep. The disciples had turned their back on Jesus and could only see the storm in all its intensity without the God who had authority over all of creation. If there was one person in the entire universe that I would want to have in the boat during the storm – that would have to be Jesus standing side by side with me – handing the storm over to Him who has always had authority over it. The thing is - every storm - every trial that we face, He is right there with us. He has never – and will never – ever jump ship and leave us on our own. Never – Ever.

So my question to you is: during the storms and trials of life, are we in that boat facing that storm on our own - or have we positioned ourselves so that the storm is dealt with by God?



Can we recognise the joy that comes from His grace through these tough times?

Finally, I have taken encouragement from Martin Luther today, who in response to the Black Plague, had this to say to his congregation:

"I shall ask God mercifully to protect us. Then I shall fumigate, help purify the air, administer medicine and take it. I shall avoid places and persons where my presence is not needed in order not to become contaminated and thus perchance inflict and pollute others and so cause their death as a result of my negligence. If God should wish to take me, he will surely find me and I have done what He has expected of me and so I am not responsible for either my own death or the death of others. If my neighbour needs me however I shall not avoid place or person but will go freely as stated above."--Luther's Works, Vol. 43, page 132.

May we each continue to trust God for his protection, do all we can to act with safety and caution...then go freely to generously love and serve others.




