Contributed article—did you know?

Charles Schulz was the creator of Peanuts (Snoopy, Lucy, Charley Brown, Linus etc) in 1950. He was a Christian but was strongly advised against including religion in his comic strips as it would "never work". No other mainstream cartoonist dared to include religious references in their strips at the time, so Schulz revolutionised his industry, he was a Christian pioneer.

"I preach in these cartoons, and I reserve the same rights to say what I want to say as the minister in the pulpit," Schulz once said.

"Little things we say and do in Christ's name are like pebbles thrown into water, the ripples spread out in circles, and influence people we may know only slightly and sometimes not at all" Charles Schulz said.

"You can grind out daily gags, but I'm not interested in simply doing gags. I'm interested in doing a strip that says something and makes some comment on the important things in life."

More than 560 of Schulz's nearly 17,800 *Peanuts* newspaper strips contain a religious, spiritual, or theological reference.

A Charlie Brown Christmas is a 1965 animated television special in which Charlie Brown searches for the meaning of Christmas and ends with Linus reading Luke 2. Originally rejected as "too religious" it became the top rating Christmas Special and has had over 50 years of success.

Given the success of *Peanuts*—at its peak read daily by 355 million in 21 languages across 75 countries—quantifying the true impact of Schulz's religious content is difficult. How many conversations around water coolers or dinner tables during the last half of the 20th century were shaped by Schulz's strips? How many were taped to cubicles or refrigerators as spiritual encouragements?

Schulz is still the third <u>top-earning deceased celebrity</u>, trailing only Elvis Presley and Michael Jackson.

An incredible achievement for someone prepared to listen to God and not the world.
